Don't Let the Politicians Throw our Families Under the Bus!

We had a great turnout from the TWU Local 250-A Membership at last Thursday's Rules Committee Meeting! Special thanks to the San Francisco Labor Council, Mike Casey from Local 2, Bob Muscat from Local 21, Firefighter's Union, Local 798, Bob Planthold from the Senior Action Network and the disabled community. We need to keep the pressure on the Board of Supervisors at this Thursday's Rules Committee Meeting to **kill** Supervisor Elsbernd's vindictive Charter Amendment. Elsbernd's Charter Amendment targets TWU Local 250-A, a union that represents a strong minority workforce that is reflective of the diverse communities we serve. Elsbernd continues to launch sustained attacks on MUNI drivers and our families; utilizing his political status and his seemingly media advantage to publish misinformation.

TWU Local 250-A Members, we need you to continue ask the other members of the Board of Supervisors to refuse to join this attack on our families. Please join us this Thursday at 10:00 AM at City Hall to convince the Board to stand up for justice, equality and respect.

Supervisor Sean Elsbernd is attacking MUNI drivers and our families by proposing to drastically cut our healthcare benefits. But he isn't stopping there. Now he wants to give politicians more power to run MUNI.

The real truth is, the MUNI is underfunded and mismanaged! As a result of a dramatic increase in fares and service reductions, the front line Transit Operators and the Public suffers.
